PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- 140 kids attended Nelson Mandela today, Feb 13
- Report cards going out Feb 14 due to all the relocations (vs Feb 12)
- Interviews are for teachers who feel like they need to meet w parents or vice versa, interviews on a needs basis. Likely encourage phone or docks meeting as ferry is going to be more difficult.
- Ferry got stuck at Hanlans in the morning hence relocation.
- Not likely to be driving thru airport to access the school due to more complications. Require federal transport. We now have 4 buses of kids versus 3 or 5 years ago. Possible waiting of up to 2 hours just to cross tarmac. Air traffic is busier now

- Wishlist, approx \$24K

 - Scientist in school would like the money for this sooner so teachers can book

- In process of planning for 2019-20 school year
- In April will be finishing school organization and class placement

ALIDA ANDERSEN – PLASTIC POLLUTION

- Scott: has not purchased or used a plastic water bottle in 2 years.
- Alida's Dad had mentioned plastic is bad for the world and doesn't go away for many years
- Turning point for her was after watching Plastic World the movie on Netflix
- Alida is a dentist. She cannot reduce plastic consumption due to health/sanitary reasons
- Involves ourselves and our kids and generations after
- As an individual, you feel like just a drop in a bucket
- Alida has created a Youtube channel to raise awareness. Interviewing neighbourhood businesses. More subscribers means more influence.
- Helping parents understand why we need to make a change
- Would like to partner with Eco Club at school to teach children
- Plastic takes 500-1000 years to break down. Doesn't actually go away. Just breaks down into micro plastics
- Food packaging is horrible and excessive
- 91% of plastic is NOT recycled
- 1. Plastic's effect on the environment
 - Made from fossil fuels depleting
 - Creates polluted air
 - The great pacific plastic patch
 - There will more plastic than fish by the year 2050
- 2. Plastic's effect on our health
 - Micro plastic is causing health problems for us

- 3. Plastic's effect on marine animals and seabirds
 - One time use plastics are dramatically
- What to do right away to change behavior
 - Bring your own bags
 - Bring your own cup
 - Choose products that use less plastic
- Goal is a zero waste lifestyle Refuse plastic is number one
- A polluted plastic item can contaminate a recycled batch of plastic and that batch would end up in landfill please clean your plastics before recycling!
- SCOTT: IPS is a platinum school. Eco club goes to classrooms conduct waste audits and to help change behavior. Looking for non-contaminated recyclables. Encourage reusable water bottles
 - Eco Club works with Science school to sort our garbage, saving on hydro, etc
 - o Tracked garbage in the classes and see the change in behavior
 - Buy specific paper for the school, charge teachers for their copies
 - o Eco Club has kids assist other students at lunch properly sort their garbage
 - Eco Club will be doing a reusable snack bag fundraiser
 - Food waste from snack program reduced
 - Can't get rid of plastic yogurt tubes
 - Cannot have anything that needs to be cleaned
 - PARENT : can we increase walk to school?
 - SCOTT: No, too much prep time lost, increased from once a year to once a month. Walk to school causes students to arrive at 10am
