Dear IPS families,

It's time for our annual ski day at Horseshoe Resort (www.horseshoeresort.com)!

We've once again secured a date on the PA Day Friday of Family Day weekend, which this year falls on Friday February 17th. This gives families a chance to take advantage of a reduced rate for a full day on the slopes (almost 60% off regular ski and rental rates). Downhill skiing, snowboarding, cross country skiing and snow tubing are offered, and rental equipment is available. Guests and siblings are welcome.

If you would like to join us, please return the form to school for EACH PARTICIPANT by **Wednesday, February 8th**, along with a cheque made payable to The Lighthouse Foundation, or mark that you paid via Interac (see order form for details.) Pricing for activities is attached. Due to Horseshoe's group rate policies **LATE REGISTRATIONS CANNOT BE ACCOMMODATED**, so please don't miss this deadline!

IMPORTANT NOTES

Parents/Guardians are responsible for transportation and for their children during the activities.

If you are renting equipment, **YOU MUST ARRIVE BY 9:00AM AT THE LATEST** because we must proceed through the rental area as a group. All other participants **MUST ARRIVE BY 9:30am** or will be charged the full admission fee by the facility.

Helmets are **MANDATORY** for downhill activities and are available for rent.

Lessons are **MANDATORY** for all students, and therefore only those students that attend a lesson during the day will be allowed to access lifts after 2:30 pm. A lesson is included in the price of a lift ticket. Once a student has attended a lesson this will be clearly indicated on their pass granting them access to the lifts. Parents wishing to have lessons for their children who are under the age of 5 please book lessons directly through the Kids Korral program. This can be done by calling 705 835 2790 ext 1286.

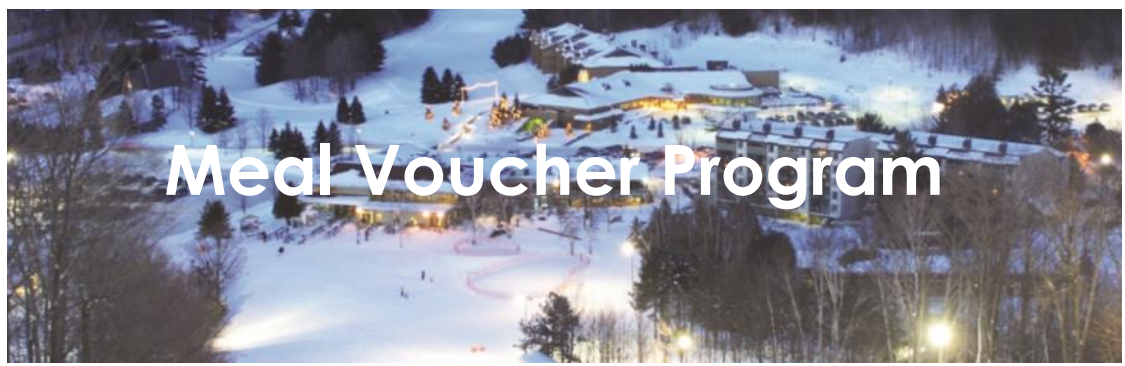

Non Skier or Non Snowboarder	First time skiing/snowboarding. Individual has never skied or snowboarded before.
Beginner	The student has skied or snowboarded once or twice or a few times per year and has experienced and maintained control on a number of novice hills of varying difficulty. He/she is able to stop and turn both directions with some success. They are comfortable on green/beginner and some blue/intermediate slopes. May need assistance with getting on or off the lifts.
Intermediate	The student has skied or snowboarded on many occasions and has experienced a variety of hills and different ski areas. He/she can turn and stop under control using recognized formal techniques. They can ski /board with confidence on blue slopes and possibly some black/advanced slopes.
Advanced	The student is an experienced and competent skier or snowboarder. He/she has received formal instruction, knows and understands the Alpine Responsibility Code and can demonstrate ability at an advanced level. Such students can be called upon to assist supervisors.

ALPINE / CROSS COUNTRY RESPONSIBILITY CODE

The Ontario Snow Resorts Association has produced an Alpine/Cross Country Responsibility Code which the named ski area _____ and the named school board _____ requires that you know and obey. Skiers/snowboarders must always ski/snowboard in control and be able to stop and change direction to avoid collisions with people or objects. The named ski area _____ may revoke a lift ticket for violation of the code or other unacceptable conduct.

All participants must wear an appropriate snow sport helmet for school excursions to OSRA member facilities. OSBIE recommends that schools adopt a mandatory snow sport helmet policy regardless of ski facility locations.
